

SR-91 Westbound & Eastbound Lane Widening Project

Nighttime Street and Ramp Closures; Daytime Pile Driving Activities at Imperial Highway

Project Overview

Caltrans and OCTA are adding a new six-mile lane in both the westbound and eastbound direction of SR-91 from approximately SR-55 to SR-241. The project will benefit commuters by increasing capacity, improving operations and relieving congestion, as well as delivering a better drive through Anaheim and Yorba Linda.

What: Nighttime lane and ramp closures will occur on Imperial Highway under the freeway overpass. In addition, crews will conduct pile driving operations at Imperial Highway, which may result in loud, repetitive noise and/or cause vibrations.

Why: Crews will conduct a nighttime partial demolition of the Imperial Highway bridge overhang to make way for the new lane. During daytime hours, crews will conduct pile driving operations to establish a foundation for the bridge widening.

When: Nighttime street and ramp closures will occur Monday, November 14 through Friday, November 18 from 11:59 p.m. to 4:00 a.m. nightly.

Daytime pile driving operations will occur Monday, November 28 - Friday, December 2; Monday, December 5 - Friday, December 9; and Monday, December 12 - Friday, December 16 from 7:00 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily.

Detours for Imperial Highway will be clearly marked with posted and electronic signage directing motorists.
